R. R. WORKER DIES OF INJURY

Anthony Marciniak Hurt in
Fall, Dies at the City
Hospital

Anthony Marciniak, thirty years old, of 523 Westside avenue, a trainman of the Lehigh Valley railroad, died about 9:25 o'clock last night at the Perth Amboy City hospital of a fracture of the skull that he is said to have received Saturday afternoon in a fall from a coal car of the company in the local yard.

Marciniak was taken to the hospital about 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon in the ambulance and his condition was critical from the start. He was attended by Dr. Charles W. Naulty, Jr., who did everything in an effort to save the man's life.

Marciniak was married and besides his wife and daughter, Dorothy, is survived by four sisters and three brothers. Mrs. Kalisiewicz, Mrs. Baumlin, Violet, Rose, Stanley, Steven and Leonard Marciniak.

The funeral will be held Thursday morning from the home of his parents, 682 State street, followed by a solemn requiem high mass at St. Stephen's Polish church, 10 o'clock. The interment will be in St. Stephens cemetery.

DRY LEADERS IN CONFERENCE

Showdown on Question for
Both National Democratic
and Republican Parties

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28. (AP)—Prohibition plank in the Republican and Democratic party platforms and the nomination of known dries for the Presidency and vice presidency were demanded here today by representatives of thirty or more national temperance organizations at a one day conference.

Resolutions calling on both major political parties to meet the prohibition question squarely were drawn up for adoption late in the day.

Patrolman John Dunham, doing traffic duty at the corner, seeing the child lying in the street, thought that the car had passed over its body. Picking the youngster up he took him to the office of Dr. Frank C. Henry, in State street. An examination disclosed a bruise on the head but no bones broken. The child is believed to have turned the handle and when the door opened he fell out.

\$25,000 LOSS REPORTED IN SOUTH RIVER FIRE

SOUTH RIVER, Feb. 28.—Damage estimated at \$25,000 was done by the fire which broke out in the idle factory of the South River Shoe and Sandal Company here last night. A two-story frame structure was also destroyed by the blaze, which spread from the plant. The cause of the blaze is undetermined.

There were no doors or windows at the plants, boys having been seen visiting the place since operations were suspended a year and a half ago.

CHECK FIRE AT WOODBRIDGE

WOODBIDGE, Feb. 28.—Members of the Woodbridge Fire Company No. 1 quickly checked the blaze, which broke out in the laundry of the home of Emil Koyen, at Barton Avenue and Freeman street, yesterday. Responding rapidly, the firemen extinguished the blaze, before it spread to other parts of the house. The damage is estimated at over \$200.
