WITNESSETH; - That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollars (\$1.00) and other valuable considerations lawful money of the United States of America, to them in hand well and truly paid by the said party of the second part, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; and the said party of the first part being therewith fully satisfied, contented and paid, have given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released, enfooffed conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell alien, release, enfectf, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns, forever, ALL those certain tracts or parcels of land and premises, hereinafter particularly described, situate, lying and being in the Township's of Fanwood & Westfield in the County of Union and State of New Jersey.

The First Tract: - Beginning at a stake in the line of a lot or piece of land that Abigeil B. Garthwaite purchased of the said William Hetfield, also in the road leading through the sprouts; thence running North forty-two degrees East and binding on the said Abigail B.
