This syllabus provides suggested resources for locating death records in New Jersey. This list is not intended to be a complete list of all possible resources. If you would like to suggest a resource not included in the syllabus, please e-mail the lecturer.

I. CIVIL DEATH RECORDS

- New Jersey State Archives (NJSA), Trenton, New Jersey: Death ledgers from May 1848 to May 1878 and death certificates from June 1878 to 1963 are available on microfilm for in-person searching at NJSA. Copies from the microfilms are only \$0.50 each. Mail-in/online requests are available at NJSA, \$10.00 per request, for deaths from 1 May 1848 to 31 December 1940.

- Department of Health and Senior Services, Bureau of Vital Statistics and Registry: Death certificates from 1941-present. Certified and genealogical copies available for mail order and in-person requests at the Office of Vital Statistics in Trenton. Cost is \$25.00 for initial search and 1 certified copy or certification of the record or a 'No Record Statement;' and \$2.00 for each additional copy. Now accepts purchases via credit card with a processing fee added.
 - Non-Genealogical/Certified Copies: Proof of a qualifying relationship (subject's parent, legal guardian, legal representative, spouse/civil union partner, child, grandchild or sibling) required for certified copies. If you do not meet a category, a certified copy will only be issued upon court order. For more information: https://www.state.nj.us/health/vital/order-vital/non-genealogical-records/
 - **Genealogical/Certification Copies:** For a death record to qualify as a genealogical record, the death must have occurred more than 40 years ago (i.e. 1982). For more information: <u>https://www.state.nj.us/health/vital/order-vital/genealogical-records/.</u>
- Local Vital Records Offices: Death records are also available from local vital records offices located within the municipality where the death occurred. Visit the municipality's website to review all requirements and fees for non-genealogical/certified copies and genealogical/ certification copies of death records.

II. CHURCH DEATH RECORDS

Many churches kept track of the deaths and burials of their congregants in addition to recording baptisms and marriages, and maintaining membership lists. Below is a sampling of sources of church records for New Jersey.

- Catholic Archdiocese of Newark: Records held by the Archdiocese of Newark were filmed by the Family History Library (FHL).
